Restoring Stability in Haiti: Addressing the Crisis of Violence and Insecurity

#### Description

Analyzing the ongoing crisis in Haiti caused by entrenched criminal gang activity, and discussing international strategies to restore peace, security, and governance in the Caribbean nation.

Corruption, impunity and ineffective governance are pushing the country's institutions to the verge of collapse.

The need to create security conditions conducive to an inclusive political process, and free and fair elections in Haiti. The far-reaching repercussions of Haiti's gang violence, political deadlock and humanitarian catastrophe pose a significant threat to the stability of not just Haiti itself, but to the entire Caribbean region.

Incalculable Consequences of the Proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) and their Delivery Systems for National, Regional and Global Security

#### Description

States and non-state actors are increasingly using, or seeking, WMD that threaten our populations, territory, and forces. Addressing these threats remains an urgent international priority.

Effects of chemical WMD and responses to chemical WMD.

Bioweapons: bacteria, viruses, and toxins pose the greatest threat to public health, may spread across large areas, carry a high risk of death, and are readily transmissible from person to person or are easily disseminated.

Given the wide array of WMD and delivery mechanisms, preparedness for all possible events is extremely challenging.

Access to Reproductive Rights: Immense Disparity in Abortion Laws Between Countries

#### Description

Addressing existing Inequities in Abortion Access

New and impending abortion restrictions and bans will undoubtedly deepen the profound inequities in abortion access that have long marked the reproductive health and well-being of pregnant people and their families. These restrictions have a significant impact on women's lives.


Importance of women's right to health during pregnancy and childbirth.

High rates of maternal mortality due to high numbers of abortions among adolescents and illegal abortions. Women's need to resort to unsafe abortion is linked to their lack of access to family planning services.

Need for States parties to increase access to family planning as well as to sexual and reproductive health information to reduce the number of unsafe abortions—and the maternal deaths that result. Also to ensure access to postabortion care to reduce maternal mortality.

General concerns about the lack of accessibility of safe abortion, particularly in cases of rape.





Addressing the Hunger Crisis in Sudan: Mobilizing International Will, Resources, and Strategies

#### Description


Discussing urgent measures to tackle the severe hunger crisis in Sudan, emphasizing the need for coordinated international efforts, resource mobilization, and comprehensive strategies.

The conflict has plunged the country into "one of the worst humanitarian nightmares in recent history" and could trigger the world's largest hunger crisis.

Acute shortages of food and clean drinking water and severely limited access to healthcare and medicines and warned of a sharp increase in the number of children killed or falling victim to sexual violence as a weapon of war compared to a year ago.

The war in Sudan risks triggering the world's largest hunger crisis. Ten months of fighting has pushed 18 million people into acute hunger.





The Shift Away from the Dollar: Analyzing the Global Implications of BRICS De-dollarisation Efforts

#### Description


Evaluating the economic, political, and strategic impacts of BRICS countries' moves to reduce dependency on the US dollar and exploring potential alternatives for global trade and finance.

The potential for a transition away from the US dollar by the BRICS countries has the capacity to weaken the US dollar's primacy and confer greater eminence to the BRICS currencies in the realm of international trade.

The discourse regarding the BRICS nations' efforts to curtail their dependence on the US dollar holds far-reaching economic, political, and geopolitical ramifications.

Involving a shift towards other currencies or the creation of new payment mechanisms independent of the dollar.





Transition towards a Multipolar World Exacerbated by Conventional Hostilities in the World

#### Description

Raising worldwide awareness of multipolarity, which simply refers to the system of international relations where there isn't a hegemon.

The post-Cold War opposition to Russian expansion (or "West vs. Russia"), the US-China confrontation, and the "War on Terror" are all going on simultaneously.

USA's unipolarity ending with the start of conventional hostilities between Russia and Ukraine.

The Israel-Hamas war causing further upheaval in a world order already fraught with tension and confrontation.
